Where can I find out about biotech companies?

Progressively identify private actors in your field by paying attention to partners and sponsors of scientific conferences in your area of study, and meeting their delegates where possible. See if your laboratory and/or university has an Alumni website where you can find former students' and where they now work. Your Region may have webpages dedicated to research and innovation, with valuable information about innovation and companies near you. Professional networks and associations federate laboratories, companies and training institutions within a specific location and sector of activity. Use their member directories to identify innovative companies in your field!

Note: competitiveness clusters in biotechnology and healthtech include: Atlanpôle Biothérapies, BioValley France, Clubster NSL which is part of Eurasanté, Cosmetic Valley, Eurobiomed, Lyon Biopôle, Innov'Alliance and Medicen. There are also clusters dedicated to related fields such as agrosciences, climate change, water, chemistry and more: full list on the official website here.

One tip to rule them all: the informational interview

There is no substitute for listening first-hand to someone's lived experience! Don't be shy, you will find that many professionals are happy to be politely approached on LinkedIn or through associations, and will dedicate some time to advise you.

If you haven't tried informational interviews yet, here are some pointers:

- Research professionals on LinkedIn in positions or companies you are curious about, and select the profiles you find most interesting. Aim for professionals with a seniority level similar to or a little higher than your own. You might start with former colleagues and classmates, or second degree relations in your network. However, dare to write to total strangers too! You have nothing to lose, many people remember their job searching times and are happy to help. Some even encourage you to reach out in their bio!
- ★ Briefly introduce yourself and explain what drew you to the person's profile. Be clear about your goal: do you want to know more about their job, or are you in the process of applying to their company? Ask if they would be comfortable answering a few questions, either in writing, via a phone call or video chat.
- ★ They agreed? Great, now is your chance to asking anything you are genuinely curious about! To help structure your interview, think about your interviewees' past (experience, transition into the job), present (day-to-day work life), and future (opportunities, related positions).

One tip to rule them all: the informational interview

- ★ Some examples of informative questions:
 - Could you tell me how you found and applied to your current position?
 - What are your responsibilities?
 - O How is your team structured?
 - What does a typical week look like? What about a typical month?
 - What are your favorite and least favorite parts of the job?
 - o Is there anything you miss about academia?
 - What are the opportunities for career advancement?
 - Would you be happy to share the expected salary range for the position?
 - Do you have any last pieces of advice?
 - Is there anyone else I should speak with, if so would you perhaps introduce me?

★ When you do accept a position, let your mentors know: they will be happy to hear your progress and celebrate your success!

As a unique European partnering event, MedFIT provides the ideal environment for academic and industrial actors to:

- Source innovative and competitive early-stage R&D projects

This year counted 600 Delegates, 30 countries represented, 75 high-level speakers, 3.000+ meeting opportunities, 90 exhibitors, 22 innovative projects presented, ...

Throwback on the MedFIT and BioFIT events

BioFIT is a major European event dedicated to technology transfer, academic-industry collaborations, early-stage innovation deals, and pre-seed, seed, and venture capital investments in the Life Sciences field. Organized jointly by Eurasanté, Clubster NSL, BioValley France, and Eurobiomed, this business convention aims to bring together key players from academic, industrial, and startup environments, promoting partnerships and facilitating investments.

The annual edition of BioFIT, now in its 12th year, took place at the Parc Chanot in Marseille on December 12 and 13, with an online day on Friday the 15th. Over these two days, the Parc Chanot welcomed more than 1 000 international stakeholders in human and animal health, representing over 35 countries, with the participation of 60 expert speakers. A program rich in opportunities was offered, including pitch sessions for startups and international project holders, roundtable discussions, booths, a plenary session, and more. The four distinct tracks covered best practices in R&D collaboration, technology development and transfer, access to early-stage investment from seed to Series A, and animal health.

Bio'M had the opportunity to take part in this event thanks to an invitation from Eurasanté and also by the General Manager of Eurobiomed, Emilie Royère. For our four representatives, Maximilien Fil (President), Sophie Mazzoli (Secretary General), Ona Kandolo (Treasurer), and Cathy Costa Da Silva (Communications Manager), this opportunity was a real privilege. They were able to interact with numerous innovation stakeholders such as Alhena Consult, French biotechs like OZ Bioscience, Cherry Biotech, Vect-Horus, and even international players like Bioindustry Park, Novalix, pharmaceutical companies like Unither Pharmaceuticals, and startups like DataMarkin. These interactions not only facilitated the creation of new collaborations but also broadened our horizons for a more diverse future forum, and significantly raised Bio'M's profile among biotech-related companies, while increasing our awareness of what our potential partners expect from our forum.
